

HTML Building Blocks - Lesson 1: Head and Body Element

Key notes to remember

1. HTML stand for Hyper Text Markup Language.
2. An HTML element is used to describe and group the data in an HTML page.
3. An HTML element is made up of two items, a beginning tag `<tag>` and a ending tag `</tag>`.
4. An HTML element can also have what is called attributes.
5. Attributes are name value pairs written `<Element attribute='value'> </Element>`. These name value pairs are used to describe the data grouped in a given element and sometimes tells the browser to treat the data in the element differently.
6. There are three main elements in an HTML document. `<HTML> <HEAD> <BODY>`
7. The head element is used to contain data that described the document or to include extra elements such as include files such as style sheets or Javascript files. The user does not see the data provided in the head in the main browser window.
8. The body element contains the main data displayed to the user.
