

Lesson 4: bold, strong, italics, and emphasized

Key notes to remember

1. Bold means to display text in **thicker and darker letters**.
2. The Bold tag is ``
3. Strong means that the text it is wrapping is something to pay attention to, something that is important.
4. Strong looks like **bold by default** but it is meant to express importance and can be changed with CSS to look totally different than bold to express that importance.
5. Bold element should never be changed to look totally different. Bold means basically to make darker, and thicker.
6. The strong element is ``
7. Italics element is another way to make a particular text be emphasized. It is just like bold in that it refers to a particular *visual representation* of text. That visual representation should not be changed to look totally different.
8. The italics element is `<i></i>`
9. The emphasized element is also used to make a particular *text stand out*. It looks just like Italics by default but the difference is that it can be made with CSS to look totally different without changing the meaning of the tag.
10. The emphasized element is ``
11. There is a delete element ``
12. The delete element marks through a word ~~with a line~~.
